

On 24 October 2020, we trekked from Bishan to Marina Bay Sands! Four groups of five members signed up to embark on our fourth trekking event together, organised as part of the TCC Healthy Lifestyle initiative.

We walked via the Kallang Park Connector and what a route it was! Situated about 2 km away from the River Plains at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park is this rustic 1.2 km walking stretch, which runs from Lorong 8 Toa Payoh to Potong Pasir Avenue 1.

As the oldest park connector in Singapore, the trees here are large and mature, housing many varieties of epiphytes on the branches and providing shade to Park Connector users. The lush greenery supports significant communities of biodiversity as well.

If you have exhausted your go-to running route, it might be time to switch things up and explore the Kolam Ayer Waterfront that links Kallang to the Serangoon area along the Kallang River. It offers spacious tracks where you can train for a marathon



or take a leisurely stroll. The Kolam Ayer bridge underwent a facelift in 2016 and was given a fresh coat of paint in a splash of bright blue, red, green and yellow. Besides its burst of hues, standing in the middle of it and playing with parallels also makes for a picturesque moment.



But that's not all - keep your eyes peeled for exciting works along the entire Kallang River over the next few years. There'll be a spiral bridge over the PIE and new underpasses at Kallang Bahru and Boon Keng Road that will improve the connectivity of this running route.

We walked past Kallang and entered the Marina Promenade near the Kallang Basin. It was a beautiful

sight as we saw people kayaking, paddling and joggers and cyclists galore. As we approached the Singapore Flyer and headed to the Helix Bridge, we realised that we had walked for more than 20km. As we approached our end point at the ArtScience Museum, the skies opened up and that probably was a signal to say the walk had come to an end.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Applicants aged 16 years and above must be a TCC member to qualify.
- For applicants under the age of 16, at least one parent must be a TCC member.
- A minimum of one year membership is required for all applications.
- Ordinary members must have regular monthly contributions to their S1 Subscription account for the past 12 months. Those with irregular monthly contributions will not be eligible unless they have a minimum balance of \$1000 in their Subscription account.
- Family & Associate members must have regular monthly contributions to their S2 Savings account for the past 12 months. Family & Associate members who have irregular monthly contributions will not be eligible.


